816868 Another question. How big is your middle? No, not your waistband - though mine is a little too large, but your personal middle ground. The preface to the 1559 Elizabethan Prayer Book set out a way of life for England in the middle of the 16th Century. Called the Via Media, its theme was tolerance of the views of others and a riposte to the extremism of the previous centuries. Written from a Christian perspective, it sought to bring the country together in way that would accept the moderate views of others. Freedom of speech but with respect for all, and with a sovereign who did not want a window into the souls of others. Tolerance and respect with a large dash of humour please. If it 'Isn't cricket' it isn't British.

813307 Now, there is a difference between extreme and enthusiastic, and it's too easy to regard the latter as the former. I often hear adverse comments about 'happy clappy' Churches, but happy clappy is going to be a better option than closed churches through nominal religion within the local community. The Jesus of the four Gospels encouraged those who would bear His name i.e. Christians, to be bold in their faith, living and sharing the full gospel of belief with a care for those around them, their neighbours, especially those in need.

812512 In Weymouth, many of our Churches live and share what they believe. We have our Street Pastors, going out into the town on Friday and Saturday nights. These are supported on those two nights by Prayer Pastors as well as local churches. There is Healing on the Streets in Maypole Square Weymouth on Saturday mornings. There is the Lantern Drop in Centre in Raneleigh Road supported by many local volunteers, some of whom give time to the Lantern Shop and cafe in Chapelhay. Local Churches support and/or run food banks, and Christians against Poverty in now up and running locally.

Nominal Christianity doesn't work, because it has nominal values. If you need help, it is right here, and if you want to help, there are plenty of opportunities.
