"The earnest (heart-felt, continued) prayer of a righteous man makes tremendous power available - dynamic in its working." (James 5 : 16 AMP).

'This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us and if we know that He hears us - whatever we ask -we know that we have the petitions that we desired of Him.' (1 John 5 : 14 – 15)

The Bible is clear, when we pray according to the will of God, He hears us and sends the answer to our prayer.

So, the key to a successful prayer-life is praying God's will.

God's Will is His Word. So, we should be praying the Word.

What better way to do this than praying the prayers of the Bible?

These prayers are inspired by God and given to us to pray. They contain the very things He wants to do for us. When we pray these prayers we are praying God's Will and so He will always hear and answer them. Often we pray our problems. Instead pray the answers. Your answers are in the Word. **PRAY THE WORD!**

Take the following prayers and pray them for yourself, your family, and those around you. Pray believing and watch what your Heavenly Father will do! You will see results because you are praying God's will in His own words.

PRAYER 1 - Ephesians 1:16-21- A Prayer for Revelation

'I continually give thanks for ____, making mention of ____ in my prayers that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give ____ a spirit of wisdom and revelation, in the knowledge of Him.

I pray also that the eyes of ____'s understanding may be enlightened so that ____ may know the hope of His calling, what are the riches of His glorious inheritance in ____, and what is the exceeding greatness of His power towards ____ who believes, according to the working of His mighty power which He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above all principality and power and might and dominion and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in that which is to come.'
